

Post Graduate Certificate Program Full Time Progression Plan-PNP Focus

This program prepares nurses who have already earned a master's degree, or higher, in nursing to sit for the national certification examination offered by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

The post-graduate PNP certificate program requires a minimum of 19 credits that are earned in 5 courses. Two courses are clinical, affording the student the opportunity to complete the 600 hours of supervises clinical practice with child populations as required in order to sit for the national certification examination. Three courses are didactic and offered via webcast and the internet, affording the student the opportunity to take these courses off-campus.

Prerequisites to registration for the required pediatric nurse practitioner courses are evidence of knowledge in the following three areas: advanced pathophysiology, advanced pharmacology, and health promotion.
